### **Education & Awareness**

#### New Drug May Prevent Recurrence

New research in mice finds a compound that prevents ovarian cancer recurrence by getting rid of the cancer stem-like cells that are left behind by chemotherapy. A team of scientists being led by Dr. Ronald Buckanovich, a professor of medicine at the University of Pittsburgh, discovered a drug that targets these stem-like cells and stops the cancer from returning. These cells can be thought of as seeds that put down roots and grow. As little as eleven of these cells is enough to grow into a tumor. The scientists set out to find a compound that inhibits a pathway known as ALDHA. The cancer cells rely on this pathway to eliminate the toxins that are produced when they replicate quickly. Through a variety of experiments, they were able to identify an inhibitor of the ALDHA1A family known as 673A, which efficiently kills cancer stem-like cells in ovarian cancer cell lines. They found that when 673A was used as a single agent, there was only a small effect on the cells. However, when combined with the chemo drug cisplatin, it was highly effective. This is an important finding because potentially lower doses could be used of both drugs, reducing toxicity for patients. 673A has the potential to significantly improve survival rates. However, as with all new drugs, it needs more work and needs to be tested in humans before we will see it on the market.

#### James*Care* for *Life* Garden of Hope

The Garden of Hope is located at The Ohio State University's Waterman Farm. It provides survivors and their caregivers access to fresh vegetables. The mission of the garden is to introduce you to *evidence-based* nutritional information on the benefits of a plant-based diet. All who participate will have the opportunity to harvest produce, receive emails with recipes and attend special programs such as cooking classes and home gardening classes. There is no charge for the use of this garden. However, all participants are required to attend an orientation prior to harvesting. The first orientation date is Saturday, April 18<sup>th</sup> 10am-11:30am at Martha Morehouse Medical Plaza-Pavilion Auditorium.

## Recipes

#### Hearty Vegetable Beef Soup

Ingredients:

- 1 lb. Ground Beef 1 can corn
- 1 can green beans
